




4-5 Barons Fold, Hoddlesden,

Sitting on a site that dates back to the 1200s, 4-5 Barons Fold is a quaint piece of local history. The original baron's estate was built in this beautiful countryside setting in 1228 and was later burned down in 1481. Upon examining records, it seems there is a gap in its history from this point... The next record is of William Fish purchasing the site – the one that stands today – in 1765, with the porch being erected later, in 1792. Written in Olde English, the original title deeds dating back hundreds of years comes with the property, complete with wax seals, solidifying the fact this property is a true piece of local history!

SO MUCH CHARACTER!

An abundance of natural exposed materials and period features makes this property an absolute delight for those looking for a home that is overflowing with character! The ground floor of this spacious yet cosy home is set over several levels which adds to its wonderful quirkiness... Beside a beautiful, curved wall near the main entrance of the house sits the original staircase leading to the first floor, where the bedrooms and bathrooms are again arranged over several levels and boast a selection of unique windows looking out onto the lush green hills. Let's take a look at the period details of this impressive property...

Featuring exposed stone walls, traditional beam work, a combination of wood, stone, and slate flooring, imposing fireplaces, mullion windows, decorative radiator coverings, and grand wooden doors and architraves... What more could you ask for of a characterful home!?

A set of flagged steps brings you to the quaint entrance of your new home, providing the perfect space to pop off your shoes and hang up your jacket.

Off the porch beyond a grand wooden door, the first reception room, currently used as a lounge, tells you of the property's mature heritage... After climbing the stairs, you are graced with a bright and airy landing and corridor leading to the bedrooms and bathrooms.

The master bedroom features fitted wardrobes and a dresser, which has spectacular views of the surrounding hills. Imagine getting ready with a view like that! Your master bedroom has a four-piece en-suite that features not only a bath, but a walk-in shower too, as well as the loo and wash basin.

The upper floor also houses two more double bedrooms, with fitted wardrobes and picturesque views through quirky windows, in addition to a single bedroom and main family bathroom.

Fancy developing the property a tad? There is an unconverted room on the upper floor with a sloped ceiling that could potentially be developed into another bedroom, or an office, via a dormer extension (subject to planning).

If you've got "green fingers" then this large country garden is perfect for you... Landscaped into different sections featuring flower beds, shrubbery and lawns, an elevated decking platform with panoramic views, this country garden really is a gem, and even comes complete a lovely yellow summer house and BBQ area!

Your outside space isn't only aesthetically pleasing, it's practical too. With a double drive off the road at the front there is ample off road parking. And underneath the elevated decking area is a mechanic's workshop and bike garage, ideal if you or your partner likes to tinker!




